

Duration: c. 10 minutes

Performance notes:



Overbowing. Apply excess pressure to the string, producing a grating sound with, at times, a resultant tone a major second below.



Irregular overbowing. Vary bow pressure, from extreme pressure and almost normal pressure, producing a continuously varying colour.

Extreme sul ponticello, rich in harmonics.

The performers should tune their violins accurately before playing the work.

The performers should play loudly enough to be heard by the whole audience. The dynamics may, if needed, be increased by one or two levels. The two violins may, optionally, be amplified though this should be done without overloading the amplifier with too many high frequencies.

Whether amplified or not, the sound should be ample, warm and full.

The work is played on a violin.

When not overbowed, the strings should be played as far as possible (n.b. bars 1-20 use the open G and D strings exclusively with the strings, the first two bars of bar 20 (violin 1)).

The music has been printed on single sided loose-leaf pages (4 pages) to enable the performer(s) to spread the music on a music stand and avoid the need for page turns.
